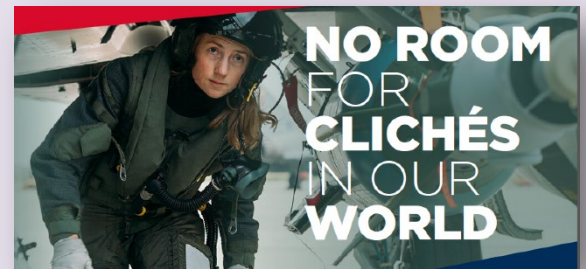

Health Careers



More and more students are applying for careers in nursing and the caring professions. Numbers are up by a third this year - with 60,000 applying to study nursing, according to the university admissions service UCAS.

Ruth May, the chief nursing officer for NHS England, said: “During COVID the level of interest in working for the NHS has trumped lots of other career options and that speaks volumes about how people recognise our profession.”

SPRINGPOD is a free careers resource service that also offers free virtual work experience. The link here will take you to their virtual work experience page where you can see the current and upcoming programmes of work experience offers.

Most of the current offers begin on April 6th and last for two weeks, and application deadlines are mostly mid-March. Each work experience offer has different eligibility and should be viewed separately. There are currently 18 offers in a variety of sectors such as health care, fashion, business, dentistry, TV and film and journalism.

Careers at Sea – Merchant Navy

Careers at Sea promote the many career opportunities in the Merchant Navy, from cadet to captain, apprentice to Chief Engineer and so many more. They are offering a FREE webinar for parents and carers on engineering roles in the Merchant Navy on board ships on March 2nd 15.30 – 16.30. In the session they will focus on the Engineering roles on board ship – maintaining and monitoring ship mechanics, from their immense engines to essential water and heating systems, as well as more complex technical electric equipment.
