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## **Year 11 Examination Preparation**

## Dear Parents/Carers

As part of the work we do to prepare our Year 11 students for their final exams we offer a number of lunch time and after school sessions. After February half term, Tuesdays after school will be for Maths revision only and Wednesdays after school will be for English revision only. We strongly recommend that all students in the year group take advantage of these opportunities. Other subjects will offer revision sessions on other evenings and lunchtimes throughout the week and wherever possible, will offer more than one session during the week in order to allow students to go to extra sessions in all subjects areas.

During the week beginning 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Year 11 students will be taking part in 'mock' examinations in English Language and Maths. These examinations will be very similar in style to the final GCSE exams that students will take at the end of Year 11.

Attached to this letter is an exam timetable for your child. Students are expected to attend all these exams.

The exams are scheduled as follows:

Date	Time	Subject
Monday 2 <sup>nd</sup> March	09:00 – 10:30	Maths Paper 1
Tuesday 3 <sup>rd</sup> March	09:00 – 10:45	English Language Paper 1
Wednesday 4 <sup>th</sup> March	09:00 – 10:30	Maths Paper 2
Thursday 5 <sup>th</sup> March	09:00 – 11:05	English Language Paper 2
Friday 6 <sup>th</sup> March	09:00 - 10:30	Maths Paper 3

Students are expected to arrive at school by 8:45am and must:

- Go to registration first
- Students must then line up by row. i.e. A1-A10, B1-B10 on the ball court outside the Sports Hall unless they are taking their exam in another room\*

If it is raining, information will be given to students, on the day, of where they need to line up.





<sup>\*</sup>Students that are not scheduled to sit their exam in the Sports Hall must go to the room listed on their timetable and wait quietly outside the room until the invigilator calls him/her in.



Students are reminded to bring the correct equipment in a <u>clear pencil</u> case for their exams:

- Black pens
- Rulers
- Pencils
- Maths set
- Calculators for Maths Paper 2 & 3

Students must be wearing the correct uniform and mobile phones and any other electronic devices must not be on or near them during the exam. School procedures are that if a student brings a mobile phone, it is handed in to the front office at the start of the day.

I would like to re-enforce the importance of these mock exams. Students will be sitting their final GCSE exams in May and June and more details about these exams will follow in due course.
